15.Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary	
<p>The HEI being an Autonomous institution facilitates the students to acquire interdisciplinary, multi-talented, skill-oriented, value-based horizontal and integral learning in align with the Vision and Mission of the Institution. Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) has been adopted for the creation, revision and implementation of the curricula for all the degree programmes. Under Outcome Based Education, the Programme Outcomes (POs), Programme Specific Outcomes (PSOs) and Course Outcomes (COs) are framed focusing on the local, regional, national and global requirements. The Courses offered are categorized as Knowledge Oriented, Skill Oriented, Employability Oriented or Entrepreneurship Oriented. All the UG students learn course contents on Value Education and Environmental Studies in the first year. The Non - Major Elective Courses offered provide an interdisciplinary learning experience along with Core courses. A rich collection of Elective courses present in our curricula and the Value-Added Courses offered meet the changing needs of the global academic environment. Social Service measures mediated through the Part-V Extension Activities such as NSS, NCC and the relevant clubs play a pivotal role in sensitizing the students towards environmental, social and health related issues. The Seminars, Workshops and training programmes organized regularly enable the students to explore new avenues of knowledge and research.</p>	
16.Academic bank of credits (ABC):	
<p>The Institution has registered with ABC/NAD – a digital repository platform which functions with a Nodal officer and members. In line with NEP 2020, students are being enrolled in the NAD Portal which aims to provide the students with academic flexibility and transferability. The Staff and students are encouraged to register courses through SWAYAM / NPTEL and MOOCs. On successful completion of such courses students can earn additional credits. By adopting these innovative techniques our students will be equipped to design their own customized learning paths and achieve exceptional academic success. Memorandums of Understanding have been signed and are functional with both Indian and foreign</p>	

institutions and NGOs to provide the students easy access to the most recent advancements globally. Since this is an autonomous institution, faculty members are encouraged to design curricula in compliance with the regulations of the University Grants Commission.

17.Skill development:

The College identifies the skill level of the students and ensures to develop three types of skills: functional, self-management and special knowledge skill among the students. The Institution follows semester pattern with the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) in all the programmes. The curriculum of various programmes offered in the institution are revised and updated periodically by incorporating the emerging trends. The structure of the curricula provides ample scope for laboratory courses, field work and project work to improve the learning skills among students. All the PG programmes have project work as a mandatory component. The HEI also offers Value-Added Courses for imparting Soft Skills and Life Skills which enable them to get holistic development. Skill Enhanced courses are mandatory in the curriculum for both UG and PG programmes. The Institution conducts Value Education Courses, Moral Education and Deeniyath classes, to all UG and PG students. These Value Education courses instil social, moral, spiritual, cultural, and emotional values among stakeholders.

18.Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

The HEI takes the responsibility to portray the importance of Indian Knowledge System to the stakeholders through various academic and non-academic activities. The HEI celebrates the Indian traditional festivals in the institution such as Samathaiva Pongal and Onam. Muthamizh Vizha function is organized to highlight the antiquity and lingual identity of the native language and culture. The Fine Arts Club of the HEI encourages the students to practice the traditional and cultural folklore. The Yuva Tourism Club visited the Jain Monument (Samana Malai) to explore the inscriptions in ancient languages. The Indian tradition and culture is taught to the students through Tamil Literature, History, Tourism and Malayalam. Various traditional competitions like Oratorical competition, Essay writing, Rangoli, Drawing and Painting, Poster Making, Street Plays, etc help the students to imbibe the Indian culture and tradition. The students are encouraged to take up online courses through NPTEL and MOOCs which will provide additional knowledge in the area of their interest. Indian languages are given due importance in the curriculum with great care and efforts are taken to uphold the Indian Culture and Tradition through teaching and learning practice in the Institution.

19.Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

Outcome Based Education was introduced in the year 2020 -21 to assess the academic performance of the stakeholders. It has been ensured that the revised syllabi of every programme aligns with the Vision and Mission of the Institution. Programme Outcomes(PO) , Programme Specific Outcomes(PSO) , Course Outcomes(CO) were drafted based on the Bloom's taxonomy and the same were displayed on the HEI's website. Due weightage is given to Continuous Internal Assessment Examinations (CIAE) which incorporate written tests, quizzes, assignments and seminars. The question papers for Term End Examinations (TEE) are being prepared under the Bloom's Taxonomy. To prioritize student - centric education, the learning community is encouraged to take part in theoretical and experimental learning through field trips, internships, industrial visits and competitions. To sensitise the faculty members with the needs

and focus on Outcome based Education, orientation programmes and workshops were conducted. The students gain comprehensive knowledge, accountability, linguistic competence, communication skills, commitment to address social and environmental threats and to act as responsible, service-minded and duty-bound global citizens.

20. Distance education/online education:

To provide 24x7 access to the learning community, the HEI has developed and launched an open access webpage designed with links to LMS, N-List, DELNET, e-resources, e-books, etc. In order to promote online education, a separate committee has been formed under the banner of Digital Initiatives, which encourages the students to enrol themselves with SWAYAM / NPTEL / MOOCs in addition to their regular courses. Apart from the Media Centre and Digital Library, the HEI has enhanced all the classrooms and seminar halls with ICT enabled tools which has made the teaching learning process more holistic. The HEI encourages the teaching faculty to upload e-contents to the stakeholders through online mode (Google Classroom). The General Library is equipped with 40 computers at a bandwidth of 100 mbps. As an outreach measure, our faculty members also upload academic e-contents on YouTube channels. The Media Centre established by the HEI, has lecture capturing system, Audio-Video facility, and a computer for editing, uploading and delivering the learning modules to facilitate remote learning for the students. Continuous efforts have been made by the HEI through Orientations, Faculty Development Programmes and Workshops for the teaching staff to upgrade their knowledge on NEP 2020.

1.3 - Curriculum Enrichment

1.3.1 - Institution integrates cross-cutting issues relevant to Professional Ethics, Gender, Human Values, Environment and Sustainability, and Human Values into the curriculum

The Curricula developed by the Departments of Chemistry, Zoology, English, History, Economics, Microbiology, and Biochemistry offer courses that address gender equity, psychological perspectives, knowledge on day-to-day healthcare, Women's development, Environment and sustainability, and human values. Courses like "Women's Writings in English", "Human Values in Literature", "Eco-Tourism", "Indian Administration", "Indian Geography", "Biofertilizer", "Green Chemistry", "Gender Economics", "Environmental Economics" and "Agricultural Economics" have been introduced. The Department of Commerce imparts professional ethics through its enriched curriculum including law, accounting and the role of accountants and managers. Further, all the UG Programmes offer "Environmental Studies" and "Value Education" courses for creating awareness on environmental sustainability and social values. In addition to academic enrichment, the introduction of activity based assessment through various Part-V Programmes such as NCC Army & Navy, NSS, YRC, RRC, Physical Education, HRC, Eco Club, Consumer Club, and Science Communication Club include cultural programs, observation of National and International Days of importance, Blood Donation Camps, Rallies, and Awareness Programmes on Social Service, Sustainability, Co-existence, Gender Equity, Cleanliness and Green Environment. Every student has to enroll in one Support Service as part of Extension activities. Course on "Research Methodology" focuses on Research Ethics to the Undergraduate and Postgraduate learners.

2.5.3 - IT integration and reforms in the examination procedures and processes including Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA) have brought in considerable improvement in the Examination Management System (EMS) of the Institution

The centralised Educational Resource Management System - FLAIR 7.5 from CLAIR VOYANT -has expedited the mechanism of the examination system and minimised the human errors. IT integration in Examination Management System ensures the transparency, timeliness and confidentiality. The HEI has introduced new safety features in the answer scripts and also in the grade sheets provided to the students.

As a part of IT Integration, The CIAE marks are entered and assessed through ERMS. The students use ERMS for applying the Term End Examination, download the Hall Ticket and pay the fees through online payment gateway. The students are allowed to download their admit card only after attendance verification through ERMS. The schedule and result of Term End Examinations are displayed in the College website. The HEI's Library is fully automated with the library networks like DELNET, N-List, and OPAC, which helps in downloading e-journals and e-books. The library has browsing facility with 43 computers exclusively for the students. The facilities like internet connectivity, reprographics and printing are available.

The General Library has a total number of 56,741 books. All books are barcoded. The mechanisms of entry of new books and lending of books are digitalized. The library has digitalized subject-wise and author-wise catalogues. The E-Gate Entry, a separate barcode reading machine is used to count the footfalls of the day to day library users. The built-up area of the library is 4490 square feet, with separate reading rooms for the staff and students. There is a Library Advisory Committee with the Principal as the Chairman, the Librarian as the Coordinator/Convener, four Faculty and the Office Superintendent are the members of the Committee. The Committee meets once in a year and sends the proposed budget to the Management for the maintenance of the Library.

Curriculum Enrichment

The HEI revises the syllabi periodically. The Academic Bodies such as Governing Body, Academic Council and Boards of Studies approves the revised syllabi. The approved syllabi were implemented in the subsequent years. The IQAC collected Feedback from stakeholders including Students, Faculty Members, Alumni and Employers. The feedback received from the stakeholders was carefully studied and necessary modifications were made in the Curriculum. The IQAC ensured that revised syllabi were framed under the OBE and CBCS patterns as per UGC guidelines.

Environmental, Green and Energy Audits

The HEI undergoes Environmental and Green Audits by competent authorities. The IQAC had promoted sustainable and eco-friendly practices in the campus. The campus faces challenges in managing water resources, waste management, conservation of natural resources, eco-friendly buildings, reducing greenhouse gas emission, recycling of waste and preventing plastic pollution. To reduce plastic pollution on college campus with special focus on the reduction and elimination of plastic bottles, plastic straws, and plastic food packaging. The students and faculty were motivated to use stainless steel bottles and glasses instead of plastic bottles.

After the revision of POs, PSOs, and COs, the syllabi are prepared and mapped by the respective course teachers. The Syllabi prepared by the Board of Studies are approved by the Academic Council and ratified by the Governing Body. Then, the approved / ratified Syllabi are updated in the College website. At the end of every semester, all the departments evaluate the POs and COs by using rubrics to analyze the Students' learning levels, Course outcome and Programme outcome attainment levels and suggesting appropriate remedial measures.

Students Satisfaction Survey (SSS) is conducted to assess the Teaching - Learning and Evaluation process based on NAAC guidelines. Students rate the question in a four-point scale. This provides the opportunity for the stakeholders to register their suggestions.

The college has made conscious efforts to enhance the eco-friendly milieu by proper segregation of degradable and non-degradable wastes as follows:

Solid Waste:

- Green and blue-coloured waste bins are placed in each building's corridors to segregate degradable and non-degradable waste, respectively.
- The waste generated in the campus includes wrappers, glass, metals, paper, etc. are put together in the garbage pit.
- Non-biodegradable and plastic waste are disposed off by the municipal collection centre.
- Leaf litter can decompose systematically over a period of time to be used as manure for the gardens in the institution.
- Sanitary napkin incinerators have been installed in the girls' hostel to facilitate the disposal of sanitary napkins in an eco-friendly way.

Liquid Waste:

- Effluents from the laboratory, hostel, and canteen are the major liquid waste.
- The laboratory waste does not contain hazardous chemicals, and periodic monitoring is done by the maintenance team.
- Laboratories have shifted the experiments from macroscale to microscale in order to reduce the chemical waste.

E-waste:

- The college has entered into an MoU with Tritech Systems, Porur, Chennai, which procures the damaged computers and other non-repairable e-waste and issues recycling certificate.
- UPS batteries are recharged, repaired, or exchanged by the suppliers.

Miyawaki - A Step towards Green Initiative (Biodiversity Forest)

The Miyawaki method is a Japanese afforestation technique that cultivates dense, mixed plantings of native plants to mimic natural forest layers. The method is effective in creating forest cover quickly

on degraded land, especially in urban environments. It captures more carbon and has higher biodiversity, making it crucial for addressing climate change and biodiversity loss. The HEI housed in Cumbum Valley, Theni District, is a significant location of farming and other agricultural activities. Therefore, maintaining ecological balance and sequestering carbon are essential components of sustainable agriculture. On contemplating the aforesaid reasons, on November 2, 2022, Department of Economics of our college, in collaboration with Nansei Arakkattalai (NGO), Uthamapalayam, established a Miyawaki initiative (Biodiversity Forest) inside the college campus. The Management generously allocated 2 acres of land with drip irrigation facility to replicate multilayered forest by planting 1100 saplings of 75 varieties of natural plants. We believe that, in the future, this forest will definitely help in maintaining sustainable environment and agriculture of this area, and also develop a habitat centre for flora and fauna, especially birds and butterflies.
