## **EXTERNAL ACADEMIC AUDIT REPORT 2022-2023**

We the external academic auditors are very much pleased to make the following observations.

## Qualitative initiatives of IQAC

- Enhanced the salary of unaided Teaching and Non-teaching staff members.
- Non-teaching staff members had been appointed in the Dean's office, common computer lab, and various departments.
- The main building's ground floor has been fully renovated.
- The existing computers in the Founder's Memorial Auditorium and Smart Classroom have been upgraded with high-configured computers with an uninterrupted power supply.
- The personal counsellor's and IGNOU Office had been renovated.
- Periodical efforts are made to submit reports for NIRF and AISHE.

#### **Functions of COE Office**

'FLAIR', software developed by a company called 'CLAIR VOYANT' was used by the office of the Controller of Examinations for the course assigning to programmes, class-wise strength, communication address, attendance percentage collection, and tracking of examination fees, preparation of examinations time table, entry of internal and external marks and retrieving the examination results in the required formats such as pass percentage, result analysis, part wise result analysis, consolidated mark statements, results of the students up to a particular semester and the department copy of examinations result. The students can access their portal by using a unique username and password. The accounts management in the software facilitates fee collection and related reports. The results of the semester examinations are published online within 10 days from the last date of the examination.

## Status of Curriculum Design and Development

- The 9th Academic Council Meeting approved the Implementation of Outcome Based Education (OBE).
- OBE, was introduced to assess the learning output of the students from the academic year 2020-2021.

- Relevant to the Local, National, Regional, and Global developmental needs, the structure and curricula were reworked for achieving Programme Educational Outcomes (PEOs), Programme Outcomes (POs), Programme Specific Outcomes (PSOs), and Course Outcomes (COs) and the ideal combination of all these outcomes are offered in all programmes.
- Educational tours were organized in various departments as an integral part of the curriculum for the knowledge enrichment and experimental learning of the students.
- The students of Zoology, Computer Science, and B.Com CA took part in an Internship programme.

#### Status of Teaching and Learning

- All 82 Classrooms, Seminar Halls and Smart Classrooms had been equipped with LCD Projectors.
- The entire campus had been networked with above 50 Mbps Wi-fi connectivity speed.
- To promote Blended learning ICT tools such as LED Projectors, Laptops, LMS, DELNET, E-Library, and Google Apps like Google Meet for online classes, Google Classroom, and Google Forms for internal tests were used.
- 3 Computer Labs, an English Language Lab and a Common Lab with Internet connectivity, and a fully Automated Library are available.
- A fully equipped Media Centre had been functioning to create and develop Econtent.
- The E- contents prepared by the Teaching staff were published on the college website.
- SWAYAM and MOOCs online courses are completed by Teaching staff and students were encouraged to enroll themselves in online courses.
- The institution collected feedback from stakeholders such as Students, Faculty, Parents, and Alumni. The received feedback from the stakeholders enabled to design the curriculum effectively.
- A faculty member from the Department of Tamil has qualified NET and 4 faculty members had completed SWAYAM/NPTEL courses during this academic year.
- 17 faculty members attended Refresher Courses and 14 faculty members completed
   Short Term Courses in various universities.

#### Status of Research and Innovations

- One faculty member received the D.Litt award during the current academic year.
- Six faculty members were awarded Ph. Ds during this academic year.
- Six faculty members have submitted their Ph.D. dissertations, and five faculty members have registered for Ph.D. programs in the current academic year.
- A total of 16 books, 6 edited books, and 4 book chapters with ISBNs were published.
- A noteworthy total of 72 research articles were published in journals listed under Referred/ SCOPUS/ Web of Science/ UGC CARE.

## Status of Infrastructure of the College

- The college provides modern technologies and amenities for the benefit of the Staff and students to enhance their teaching and learning efficiency.
- Ramps were built at the entrance of all buildings.
- Renovated the dining hall for men students.
- Toilets for the differently abled were constructed.
- The college canteen was renovated.
- Fire extinguishers were installed in proper places in all the buildings.
- Banisters are provided in all the staircases for the safety of differently abled students.
- The Campus is Green, Eco-friendly, Tabacco Free and Plastic Free.
- A digital display board was installed in the college.
- E-Service, a student self-service facility, was established.
- · Bio-Gas Plant had been installed.
- The Ground Floor of Administrative Block had been fully renovated.
- The CIAE and Deans offices had been renovated and equipped.
- The Personal Counsellor's and IGNOU Office had been renovated.
- The existing computers in the Founder's Memorial Auditorium and Smart Classroom had been upgraded.

## Status of Student's Support and Progression

- A separate mentor had been assigned for each class.
- The mentor monitors the student's Academic progress periodically.
- The students were provided with proper guidelines from the mentors of their respective classes.
- The slow learners were given special attention through remedial classes.
- Student Induction Programme (SIP) was conducted for the freshers and given orientation in their department and informed about the Mission and Vision, Code of Conduct, Student- Support Services, and Part — V activities of the college.
- Funds through Baithulmal and the Students Welfare Fund were provided to the financially weaker students.
- The student council had been functioning in the institution providing powerful leadership skills and learning opportunities to the students.

## Status of Library

- The college General Library has a total number of more than 56, 741 books.
- The college has an Integrated Library Management system which is extensively
  used to keep track of the inventory of books, footfalls, purchases, and
  subject/author-wise availability.
- Issuance and receipt of the books are done through barcode readers.
- DELNET, N-LIST, and INFLIBNET facilities had been provided in the Library.
- A total of 53 Journals and 42 Magazines were subscribed.
- Faculty and students were given remote access to E-resources of the Library.

#### **Activities of the National Service Scheme**

- The National Service Schemes units of the college had been rendering commendable service by involving the volunteers in many social supporting activities.
- The NSS units in accordance with the state-wide initiative launched by the Government of Tamil Nadu conducted an Awareness Programme with the title Drive and Pledge – Drug Free Tamil Nadu on 11<sup>th</sup> August 2022. More than 100 volunteers took the pledge against drug abuse.

- The NSS units celebrated the 75<sup>th</sup> Independence Day by conducting Street Play with the volunteers.
